

Julian Winslow Serving As Chowan Fund Chairman

Chowan College has passed the \$1 million mark in pledges and gifts in its drive to secure funds for a new \$1.2 million science-engineering facility according to Julian Winslow, Jr., chairman of the Hertford division of Chowan's "Mission Possible" development fund program. Winslow, a Chowan advisor, said that \$1,007,000 had been

received in gifts and pledges. The general chairman of the "Mission Possible" campaign, Don G. Matthews, Jr. of Hamilton, noted that an additional approximate \$96,000 is needed for landscaping, parking and lighting. The campaign was launched in September, 1971 with an initial gift of \$100,000 from Mr. and Mrs. Elwood W. Parker of Murfreesboro. Chowan's own faculty and staff pledged \$107,000. The Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation of Winston-Salem has made two grants totaling \$70,000, Matthews said. The first was for \$25,000 and the second, a challenge grant, for \$45,000. Meeting this challenge grant has enabled Chowan to top the one million dollar mark, Matthews explained.

Persons May Apply

Under a new Federal program, people in financial need age 65 or older or who are blind or disabled can now apply for monthly cash payments at the Elizabeth City Social Security District Office.

Starting in January 1974, the new Supplementary Security Income Program will take the place of the present Federal-State programs of public assistance payments to aged, blind, and disabled people with limited income and resources. Until the Federal supplementary security income payments start next January, state and local public assistance offices will continue to make payments in the usual way.

The aim of the new program is to provide Federal payments so that anyone 65 or older or blind or disabled can have a basic cash income of at least \$130 a month for one person and \$195 a month for a married couple. The law further requires that generally, no person will receive a payment less than he received under the State program before the Federal takeover.

The people already receiving state assistance payments under the aged, blind, or disabled categories do not have to apply for payments under the new program. They will receive information later this year on how the program will affect them.

Conservation Workshop Held In Williamston

A workshop for Area Five Soil and Water Conservation District Clerks and District Conservationists and Technicians with the Soil Conservation Service was held recently at the Town and Country Restaurant in Williamston. Approximately fifty employees of these two organ-

izations, serving the 20 county Northeastern Area Five, attended.

The purpose of the workshop was to establish a better understanding of the working relationship between District Clerks and District Conservationists or Technicians assigned together in individual county field offices and working to carry out the objectives of their District's program of soil and water conservation.

Jim Canterbury, Area Conservationist with the Soil Conservation Service, was moderator for the meeting which was more or less an open discussion to formulate ways and means of working together to bring about a more effective program of soil and water conservation.

The meeting was open to anyone having suggestions to this intent, but there were short talks by several members of both organizations. District Clerks, Charlotte Wheeler from Northampton County, Shelby White from Chowan, and Ruth Woodley of Tyrrell County along with District

Conservationist John Litchfield of Northampton County and Wilson Spencer, Conservationist for Tyrrell, Dare, Washington and Hyde Counties participated in the program. Grady Lane and Mike White, members of the State Soil and Water Conservation Committee, coordinator for Soil and Water Conservation Districts in North Carolina, were on hand to discuss responsibilities of District Clerks in assisting the District and SCS. Garland Strickland, District Supervisor from Nash County and Treasurer of the N.C. Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts, spoke briefly and presented his views as to the role both District Clerks and SCS personnel should have in assisting Districts.

Canterbury relates that the meeting was a success as many ideas were discussed and plans formulated for District Clerks and SCS personnel to work together to provide more technical assistance to landusers and strengthen the conservation movement.
