The old art of quilting is being revived in Johnston County by both young and old.
In order to learn the quilting techniques, interested homemakers attended classes in quilted pillow tops, notes Mrs. Patricia Brown, associate home economics extension agent.
One young homemaker, Mrs. Pete Sturm of Smithfield, developed an interest in quilting after finding a set of quilted placemats in a craft shop for \$35. After attending the class, she is making a similar set at a much lower cost.
For her next project, Mrs. Sturm plans to make each of her three boys a little farm boy quilt using their old worn out blue jeans in the farm boy design.
This is an excellent way to recycle old clothes into something useful and as a keepsake for each child, the agent verifies.

MAKE UTENSILS
Some everyday kitchen utensils can be adopted so that handicapped homemakers can use them easily. A handle holder can

steady a hot saucepan on the range, a wooden bowl holder makes it possible to stir or mix ingredients with one hand, and a peeling and cutting board, consisting of a formica-topped base board and nails, makes it possible to grate carrots using one hand.

Energy Tips Given

This is another in a series of Civil Preparedness Energy Conservation Tips from Perquimans County Civil Preparedness Office.
Did you know that washing clothes takes a lot of water. An 18 pound load can use as much as 48 gallons!

You'll be money ahead to wait until you have a full load before using the washer and dryer.
Sort laundry into similar colors and types of fabrics. This will help you get proper wash loads and better cleaning. Badly soiled clothes should be soaked instead of being washed twice. If your washer doesn't have a soak cycle, allow the tub to fill, let the agitator work long enough to create suds, then turn the washer off for a while. After the clothes have soaked for several minutes, turn the washer on to continue with the cycle.
Whenever possible, wash clothes in cold water using a cold water detergent. Many of today's fabrics don't need or can't tolerate hot water. Be sure you use the proper amount of detergent. Check instructions on the package. Not all detergents produce volumes of suds.
Hang clothes on a clothesline when possible, or use the shortest drying cycle that will get the clothes dry. Underdrying all fabrics, particularly polyesters and knits, will extend their life, prevent gradual shrinkage.

Fusing Adds Dimension To Making Own Clothes

RALEIGH — A needle and thread is no longer the only way to sew. The fusible products now on the market mean "sewing" possibilities, both for those who sew and those who don't, observes Harriet Tutterow, extension clothing specialist, North Carolina State University.
The new fusible is merely a product that melts when heated. And the way it works in sewing is to lay this product, the fusible, between two pieces of fabric that you want to have fastened together. Press with an iron. But all fusibles can come

dried with heavier cotton items such as light colored towels.
Clean the lint filter after each load if your washer or dryer is equipped with it. Occasionally vacuum around and inside your dryer where lint collects.

"unfused" if they're not treated properly, cautions Miss Tutterow.
For one thing, not all fabrics fuse well. Sometimes the iron temperature and the amount of time required for fusing can damage the fabrics you're trying to stick together. Or the fabric you're working with may be too slick or sheer to hold a "fuse" job.
Miss Tutterow suggests you experiment first with a scrap of fabric and the fusing material. It may save you some grief.
Also do a thorough job of reading the label on the fusible before you buy.
