The General Assembly appropriated funds for the program which involves students in Kindergarten through the sixth grade. Funds were allocated to the school systems on the basis of average daily membership.

The money can be used for instruction, supplies or equipment in the elementary physical education program.

However, not enough money was allocated to employ such a person on a full-time basis, so local funds were used to support those received from the state.

Sharon teaches the students a variety of things, such as group activities, team sports, individual sports and activities, and indoor activities.
