
Despite smaller 1974 grain crops and substantial farm exports, American consumers need have no fear of food shortages. The bad weather which cut our feed grain production was a dramatic development which attracted national attention. As a result of this emphasis, consumers gained the impression that we faced a food crisis.

Our 1974 feed grain crops will be sufficient to meet our needs and provide for some exports. Adjustments will be made within the marke system. Less grain will be fed to livestock and export demands are expected to be less than in 1973. Consumers will continue to have ample food supplies this year and the years ahead if farmers are allowed to produce and receive a fair return for their products.
