

Beaman Presides in District Court

Judge Grafton Beaman presided at the Wednesday session of Perquimans County District Court, and heard the following cases:

Marshall Dwight Dav- enport, charged with driv- ing under the influence of intoxicating liquor, was given a 60-day sentence, suspended for 1 year, a fine of \$100.00 and costs, ordered to surrender his driver's license to the Clerk of Superior Court, and not to operate a motor vehicle for a period of 12 months;

Albert Westley Williams was found guilty of driving under the influence and received a 60-day sentence suspended for 1 year, a fine of \$100.00 and costs, ordered to surrender his driver's license to the Clerk of Superior Court, and not to operate a motor vehicle in North Carolina for 12 months (after December 11, 1974);

Broachie Oliver Carpenter was found guilty of driving under the influence and received a 60-day sentence suspended for 1 year, a fine of \$100.00 and costs, ordered to surrender his driver's license to the Clerk of Superior Court, and not to operate a motor vehicle in North Carolina for a period of 12 months;

The State took a Nol Pro in the case of Calvin Godfrey, who was charged with driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor;

Ricky Wayne Trueblood, charged with speeding and driving under the influence, was given a 60-day sentence suspended for 12 months, a fine of \$120.00 and costs, ordered to surrender his driver's license to the Clerk of Superior Court, not to operate a motor vehicle during the period of suspension, and not violate any State or Federal laws;

James Percy Menier, Jr. received a 60-day sentence suspended for 1 year, a fine of \$100.00 and costs, and surrender his driver's license for 12 months, after he was found guilty of driving under the influence;

Robert Allen Hunter, charged with driving under the influence, by allowing a motor vehicle under his custody to be operated while driver was under the influence, received a 60-day sentence suspended for 1 year, a fine of \$100.00 and costs, ordered to surrender his driver's license to the Clerk of Superior Court, not to operate a motor vehicle in

North Carolina for 12 months, and not to violate any State or Federal laws;

In the case of Ida B. Ange, who was charged with assault with a deadly weapon, the prosecuting witness, Janet Lee, was found in contempt for refusing to testify, and ordered to pay a fine of \$10.00 and costs;

In the case of William Harris, charged with assault with a deadly weapon, the prosecuting witness, Betty Harris, was found in contempt, when she refused to testify, and ordered to pay a fine of \$10.00 and costs;

Robert Vaugus Wilkinson was taxed with a fine of \$35.00 and costs when found guilty of speeding and transporting an alcoholic beverage with a broken seal;

Donald Jackson Riddick was taxed with a fine of \$25.00 and costs on a speeding charge;

Milford Joseph Baum was taxed with a fine of \$10.00 and costs when found guilty of improper passing;

Bobby Horton Sherron was taxed with costs on a speeding charge;

Sharon Cozette Elliott was found guilty of having no operator's license and given a fine of \$25.00 and costs (fine to be paid Friday, December 13);

Thomas Roy Slade was taxed with a fine of \$40.00 and costs when found guilty of speeding;

Roy Morrison Melton was fined \$75.00 and costs on a speeding charge, and ordered not to violate any State or Federal laws.

Coastal Resources Commission Meet

The Coastal Resource Commission met in New Bern, N.C. on Nov. 10 and 11. The meeting was an effort to put the finishing touches on the planning guidelines to be used by local governments of the 20 coastal area counties with the preparation of their own individual land use plans. Perquimans is one of the 20 counties involved.

When completed these 20 individual county land use plans will form the basis for a "comprehensive plan for the protection, preservation, orderly development, and management of the coastal area of North Carolina," which is the primary objective of the Coastal Area Management Act of 1974.

Representative on the advisory council present was R.S. Monds. He attended a meeting of the

council on Monday and a joint meeting of the Coastal Resources Commission and Coastal Resources Advisory Council on Tuesday.

The advisory council consists of 45 members from the coastal counties, their purpose being to assist the Coastal Resources Commission in interpreting and implementing the Coastal Area Management Act.

The Coastal Resources Commission consists of 15 members appointed by the governor of which T. Eerie Haste, Jr. is the Perquimans County representative.

The next meeting of the Coastal Resources Commission will be held in the Wilmington area on January 14 and 15. Much of this meeting will be devoted to finalizing and adopting the guidelines. Attending will be T. Eerie Haste, Jr.
