## SCS Data Assists Land Use Decisions

The policy of the Soil Conservation Service is to provide accurate and factual data to assist landowners and other decision makers in making wise choices in land use, State Conservationist Jesse L. Hicks said today.

"Our policy has been the same for four decades, and as we observe the 40th anniversary of SCS, we need to restate this," Jesse Hicks continued.

Soil surveys, he said, furnish a good example. "It is one thing to point out that there are severe limitations for home building on a certain site. It might be

unsuitable either for building or for septic tanks, and this should be made clear to those planning a housing development. But it is quite another course to state flatly that the SCS has decided that building should not be done. Local officials must decide this for themselves, after weighing the data available," he explained.

The SCS will not make the decisions for others, the state conservationist emphasized. "There is a real distinction between providing the facts, pointing out possible alternatives, and actually making the decisions," he added.

The state conservationist pointed out that there is one possible exception to the general policy. "The policy of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and therefore of the SCS, is to encourage protection of prime agricultural land from encroachment. But even in this case SCS soil conservationists and other employees can probably be most effective when they offer local people workable alternatives to taking good land out of farming. And I hope we will work this way."

Charles E. White III of Hertford was among some 2,700 seniors and graduate students to receive their degrees at North Carolina State University on Saturday, May 14. White, the son of Mr. and Mrs. C.E. White Jr. received a bachelor degree in mechanical engineering. With the conferral of the 1975 degrees Chancellor John T. Caldwell raised his total to 61 per cent of all the degrees conferred in the University's 88-year history. Fields of study represented by the graduates included all of the University's 80-plus bachelors degree fields, 65 masters degree fields and 46 doctoral areas.
