During Appalachian State University's 76th Summer Commencement, held August 9, Patricia Anne Lane of Hertford was awarded a Bachelor of Science teaching degree in elementary education.

Some 741 degrees were conferred by ASU Acting Chancellor Dr. Cratis Williams at the 10 a.m. ceremony.

Some 369 seniors received the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Technology and Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degrees.

Graduate degrees, including the Master of Arts, Master of Science, Certificate of Advanced Study, Science Specialist and Education Specialist, were conferred to 372 students.

Two ASU students delivered the commencement address. Kent R. Oehm, a graduating senior from Dumont, N.J., defended the arts as an important and necessary part of education; and Jonathan B. Pierce, a master's degree graduate from Asheville, discussed education as a tool for political effectiveness.
