Perquimans County Horse & Pony Club

This week, the Civic Club Spotlight focuses on the Perquimans County Horse and Pony Club, a unique organization that involves the entire family in its activities.

The club was chartered in 1967 with the help of Pete Thompson, Perquimans County Farm Agent at the time and Calvin Chappell, then president of the Albemarle Horse and Pony Club. The club was founded to operate recreational facilities for horsemanship, horse and pony riding and horse shows for pleasure and recreation. Present club member who were members when the club was first formed are the Robert Sutton, Melvin Forehand and C.T. Rogerson Jr. families.

A horse show ring was built on the Willie Ainsley farm on the Hertford-Edenton Highway. The ring was there about two years and was then moved two miles west of Hertford on the Preston Nixon farm until 1974. The ring was then relocated to its present site on the Joseph Perry Jr. farm. The 1975 membership was 30 families. The membership is based on individual families and not the number of family members, so actually about 100 adults and children in the Albemarle area are involved in the Perquimans County Horse and Pony Club.

Several local club members belong to the American Quarter Horse Association and the North Carolina Horse Council. Donna Stallings, Sandy Weeks, Shirley Jones, Denise Harrell, and Eddie Fowler are members of 4-H. Also, there were several members who took part in the Mid-Winter Horse Show in Raleigh for the last three years.

Whedbee, presiding. Each one of the 72 members has been notified to be at the meeting and has also been advised as to the subjects, to be taken up. The three subjects to be taken up on Friday night are the fire hazard at the Hertford Grammar School; the sports and recreations committee report and the report on the planning committee.

INDEXING SYSTEM OF COUNTY RECORDS IN PERQUIMANS IS NOW NEARING COMPLETION: What was once a tedious task for lawyers and other who search land records in Perquimans County, or those who search the records for any other reasons for that matter, has become, through means of the new indexing system now nearing completion, a small and simple matter. Three well-bound volumes, covering the period between 1877 and 1938, are already in use, and those who have had occasion to use them are loud in praise of the index system. When the next three volumes, giving the grantee first and making a complete cross index system, are completed, the work on the old records, from 1685 to 1877, will be commenced. The work, which is a WPA project, done in conjunction with the supervision of Mrs. P.H. Small, is beautifully done. Miss Gussie Wood has done all the typing, while those who have done the preliminary clerical work include Mrs. Jessie O. White, Miss Gladys Ward and B.G. Koonce. The work on indexing began two years ago, approximately nine months more will be required to complete the project.
