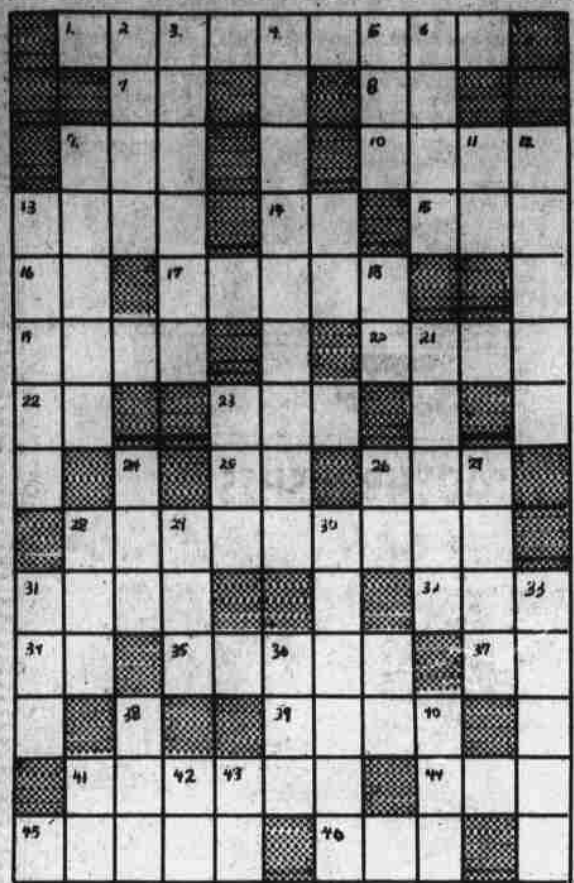

Dennis G. Smith of Rt. 3, Hertford enlisted in the U.S. Air Forces Delayed Enlistment Program today, according to TSgt Clark Sessoms, USAF Representative in Elizabeth City.

The Air Force Delayed Enlistment Program allows Dennis to enter the Air Force for active duty up to six months after enlistment. He is scheduled to attend the Air Force six-week basic training course on 29 June 1976. He will then receive technical training in the Administrative Career Field.

Dennis is a senior at Perquimans County High School and is the son of Mr. and Mrs. James G. Smith, also of Hertford.

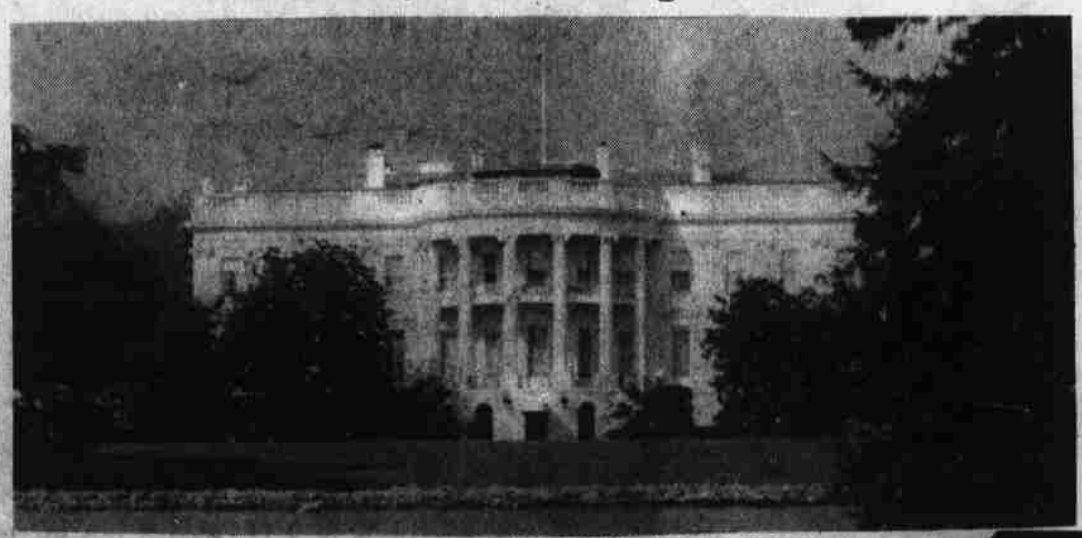
