

## Miss Howell Enjoys Work With Schools

Miss Howell, a professional home economist as well as an educator, met with representatives of Nutrition Dynamics, Inc. in June 1975 while attending the American Home Economics Association convention. Nutrition Dynamics are pioneers in presenting nutrition education in young children in lieu of reeducating older children who have already established poor nutritional habits.

In her home economics training, Miss Howell has been involved in course work on child development as well as foods and nutrition and was one of the first three teachers qualified to teach child care services to vocational education students in the state of North Carolina. Miss Howell has earned a BS in home economics education at the University of North Carolina, Greensboro; a MS in home economics education at Iowa State University; and an Advance Certificate in Education at the University of Illinois.

Working with the kindergarten children, their teachers and aides has been described by Miss Howell as a unique experience. Much of the success of the nutrition program rests upon the follow-up provided by the teachers and aides in the regular classroom. Total cooperation by these individuals has resulted in a meaningful and rewarding nutrition education program.

# Night Movement... nothing new!

When this flock of **Cutt Brown** chickens were being moved to market, it was something new and strange. **Cutt** was one of **Perdue's** first growers in eastern N.C.
