Perquimans Voters Agree With Statewide Choices In Primary

In the March 23 showing a preference to Ronald Reagan on the Presidential Primary, former Georgia Governor Perquimans County voters Jimmy Carter on the Democratic ticket and also passed the bond for Higher Education by a vote

of 668 in favor and 457 against. The Constitutional Amendment No. 1 (Health Care) was also favored by Perquimans voters 660 to 402. The second

Constitutional Amendment involving industrial revenue sharing bonds passed by a county total vote of 664 for and 373 against. The following are the total votes:

Receives Grant

The EIC, Inc. has been awarded a combined grant of approximately \$40,000.00 from the Community Services Administration Office and State Economic Opportunity Office to conduct a Home Winterization Project for Region "R".

The Home Winterization Project will focus upon the elderly, handicapped and low-income families who are affected by the high cost of fuel and the impact of cold weather due to cold air infiltration in the home.

The EIC, Inc. Home Winterization will include the replacement of broken windows, minor roof repairs, weatherstripping of doors, increased attic insulation, siding repairs and in some cases underpinning.

Winterization work crews, under the supervision of skilled carpenters, will determine the extent of needed repairs and make the actual repairs to the home. All supplies and building materials will be provided by the agency.

A Regional Winterization Advisory Committee has been organized to monitor the project and to recommend priority families for program participation.

Applications for participation may be acquired at any county Economic Resource Center or the EIC Administrative Office in Elizabeth City, or Edenton, N.C.

SCHOLARSHIPS

High school musicians will have the opportunity to compete for six scholarships, valued at \$500 each, offered by Chowan College's department of music.

The \$500 scholarship covers two years of study at Chowan. Two each will be offered in keyboard, voice, and band-orchestra, according to Dr. James Chamblee, chairman of Chowan's fine arts department.
