Vacationers who use the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel in their travels may not know it but they are motoring over the spot where the French sank British hopes for victory in America's War for Independence. A marker on Sea Gull Island, one of four man-made islands in the 17.6-milelong Bridge-Tunnel, commemorates the success of the French fleet in thwarting the British navy's efforts to reach Cornwallis at Yorktown. Unable to retreat or to receive reinforcements, the British general surrendered his army, the 2nd largest on the continent. It was the beginning of the end of the British rule in the 13 colonies.
