Punt, Pass & Kick Opens

Registration for the area's 16th annual Punt, Pass & Kick competition for youngsters eight through 13 years of age will remain open through Sept. 10.

Nationally, more than 1,200,000 youngsters are expected to take part in this year's program sponsored by the Ford Dealers of America in cooperation with the National Football League. Registration blanks and local competition details are available at Winslow-Blanchard Ford Motor Company, Hertford.

Punt, Pass & Kick has attracted more than 12 million participants since its inception in 1961, in addition to the enthusiastic support of high school, college and professional football coaches
