

Currituck Knights Are Triumphant Over Perquimans Pirates, 14-6 Friday Night

The name of the game was defense last Friday night in Currituck's new sports complex as the Currituck Knights triumphed over the Perquimans Pirates, 14-6. The most exciting game played so far by the favored Pirates was also one that most Pirate fans walked away saying, "if only..." If only the Pirates could have put together a substantial drive. If only they hadn't fumbled with three minutes left. If only the late fourth quarter pass had not been dropped. But the difference in the game, few thinking it at the time, was a 52-yard scoring drive capped by Kenny McPherson's three-yard pitch out from Knight

captain, Ricky Etheridge. The drive took eight minutes and 28 seconds as the Pirate defense gave, but held tight down to the last yards. The Currituck defense was stinger than Perquimans, allowing Charlie Sutton, the big junior fullback, only 22 yards. Except for two runs, the Pirates were completely stopped on the ground. The first two drives showed a lot

of promise, but from there it was all down hill. An end-around to Carl Zachary was the longest run of the night. Zachary ran 63 yards to the Currituck five. Two plays later, Sutton scored the only touchdown that the visitors were to score. Louis White helped the Currituck cause by evening the score at six. White car-

ried the ball two yards with five and one-half minutes left in the half. Currituck made mistakes early in the game; two of Etheridge's passes were picked off in the first period. But, the big mistakes were made by the Pirates. The last Pirate threat ended in a fumble by back-up quarterback Marvin Hunter. Many felt Hunter should have been brought in earlier, as just a play before he delivered a perfect toss only to have the spiral slip between his receiver's fingers. The other late-in-the-game drive was abruptly halted on the Knight 25 as the Pirates were forced to punt. Michael Flythe aided the drive in a 32-yard dart.

After the second period score, it turned into a punting game. Neither team could move the ball. But after a Pirate fumble with 4:15 left in the third quarter, Currituck started what looked to be another harmless drive. It turned out to be anything but that.

The main point in the game was the Pirates' inability to set up any type of rushing game. Currituck keyed on speedster Charlie Sutton and expect for a couple of breakaways, no other back could take up the slack.

The Pirates come home Friday for another tough conference contest against the inconsistent Northampton team.

The total amount of Community Development Block Grant Funds available to Hertford is limited to \$500,000.00 per year for discretionary funds. 1. Acquisition of property which is: blighted; appropriate for rehabilitation, conservation, or preservation; needed for the provision of eligible public works, facilities and improvements; or to be used for public purposes.
2. Public works, facilities or site improvements including: neighborhood facilities, utilities, streets, street lighting, water and sewer facilities, recreation facilities, flood and drainage facilities, fire protection services, senior citizen centers and historic properties.
3. Clearance, demolition and rehabilitation projects.
4. Rehabilitation loans and grants.
5. Planning, administration and management costs as related to community development activities.
6. Costs associated with disposition of real property through community development activities.
7. Completion of urban renewal projects.
8. Provision of public services to improve employment, economic development and other community development services.
9. Relocation and loss of rental income payments due to displacement by program activities.
10. Code Enforcement Program.
11. Special projects to remove architectural circulation or mobility restrictions for the elderly or handicapped.

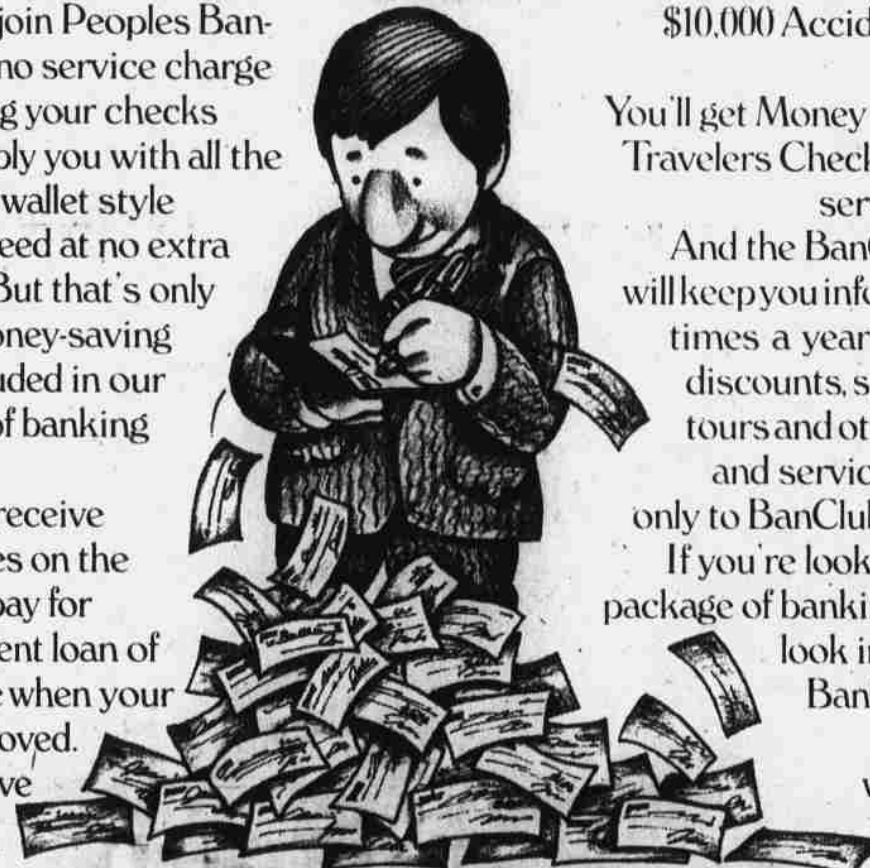
