One of the highlights of Wilmington's 1977 Azalea Festival will be two special presentations of the world famous Sound and Light Spectacular, "The Immortal Showboat" on Friday and Saturday nights, April 15 and 16 at 8 p.m. at the USS North Carolina Battleship Memorial. The show, which has gained prestige as the longest running fully automated Sound and Light show in the world, has been seen by some 320 thousand patrons from every state in the nation and many foreign countries since its initial presentation in 1965.

Poet and writer Samuel Haso will be featured at a Spring Poetry Festival scheduled at Ramada Inn in Greenville, N.C. April 29-30. The festival is sponsored by the East Carolina University Poetry Forum and the N.C. Arts Council and is intended to bring both professional and amateur poets together for seminars and individual consultations in the art of poetry. 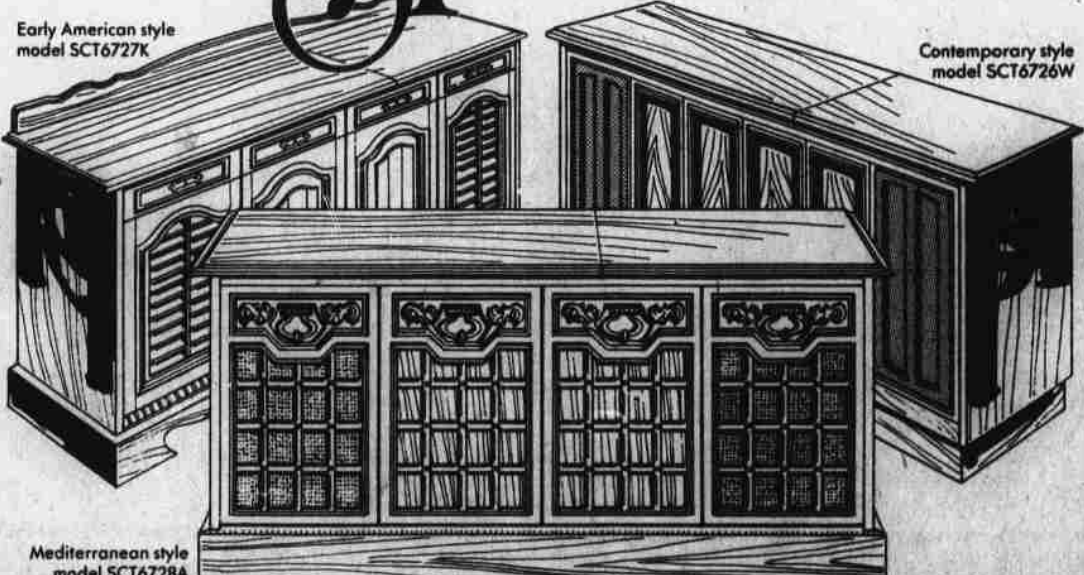
