Smooth-Top Stove

RALEIGH — The new smooth-top kitchen ranges have a split personality. Their glass, ceramic surfaces have no visible burners. So with a flip of the switch, they become a cooking unit or counter-top.

But this style of range also demands new cooking and cleaning habits on behalf of the cook, reminds Mrs. Edith McGlamery, extension house furnishings specialist, North Carolina State University. So study the range before buying.

Learn what kind of cookware is required, she suggests. Some models require special ceramic cookware, ground and polished and perfectly flat to capture heat.

Other models with higher temperatures require only ordinary cookware, pots and pans that are reasonably flat on the bottom and that will stay flat when hot.

Remember to examine the warranty before buying, the specialist cautions. Check guarantees on parts, labor and heating units.

The smooth-top ranges have a good record for strength and durability. And Underwriters' Laboratories have tested a number of models for durability and electrical safety. So look for the UL symbol.

Smooth-top ranges come only in white and will stain if spills aren't quickly wiped up. A special cleaner-conditioner should be used on it often.
