

Freshmen Orientation Planned

An orientation sponsored by the Perquimans County High School Guidance Club will be held May 11 for students who will enroll as freshmen for the 1977-78 school year.

The program will start at 12:30 p.m. with a tour of the campus and buildings. Following the tour, an assembly will be held in the school auditorium.

Carol Skinner, Guidance Club President will preside at the assembly and a welcome will be extended by William E. Byrum, principal. Miss Skinner will also introduce the program participants.

James S. Midgette, PCHS Guidance Counselor, said, "Any new situation creates a feeling of insecurity. This is true whether it involves

an adult changing employment or a person entering the armed services, or a child changing schools."

Because of this, Midgette pointed out that schools have found it necessary to provide many different forms of orientation to new situations experienced by pupils. These experiences include starting school at the kindergarten level, changing from elementary

school to junior high, and from junior high to senior high, and finally changing from high school to college or other post high school educational activity and preparing for employment. He said, "In all these situations, there are rules of the road to learn and there is a need to become acquainted with the new environment in order to bridge the gap between the old and the new."

Community leaders, law enforcement officials, and other concerned citizens agree that the Telephone Reassurance Service is one that is needed in the area.
