Soil Stewardship Week, a nationwide observance which emphasizes man's responsibility to protect and conserve soil, water, and other natural resources will be May 15-22 this year, Floyd Mathews, Chairman of the Perquimans Conservation Committee, announced today.

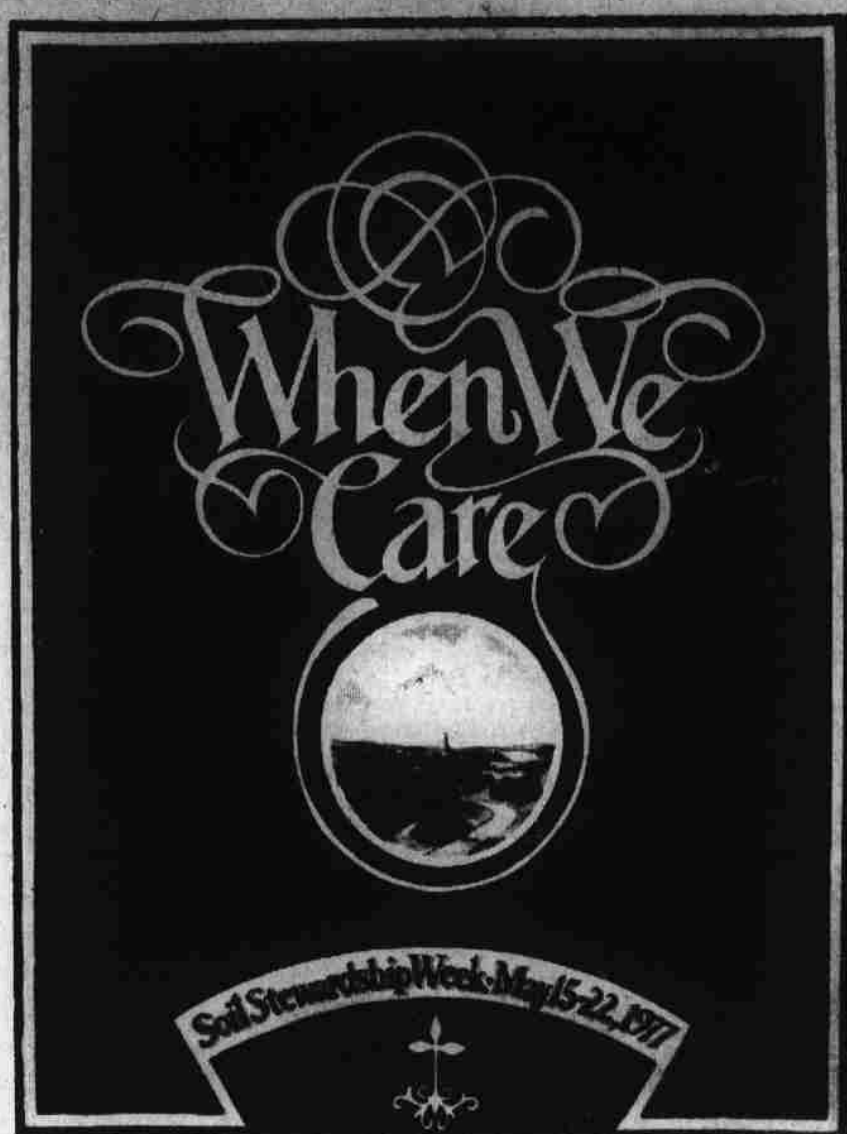
"This year's theme, 'When We Care,' will help each to examine his own motives and actions in the conservation of God's manifold gifts," said Mr. Mathews.

"We hope, that during Soil Stewardship Week, millions of Americans will pause for a moment to consider their responsibilities for the protection and proper care of the Lord's earth," stated Mr. Mathews.

Members of the Perquimans Soil Stewardship Committee, are Floyd Mathews, Elmer Lassiter and Carroll Williams.

The District has provided local churches with a reference booklet, and bulletin inserts designed for this year's observance. The material was prepared by the Soil Stewardship Advisory Committee of the National Association of Conservation Districts. The advisory committee is composed of church men of various faiths.

This is the 23rd consecutive year that the National Association of Conservation Districts, along with almost 3,000 local districts throughout the nation, has sponsored Soil Stewardship Week. The custom of setting aside special "Rogation Days" for this purpose began more than 1,500 years ago in France, when French peasants prayed for help after crop failures had brought widespread hunger.

Out of Style Neckties Used to Make Pillows

Looking for a way to use your husband's out-of-date neckties? Mrs. Grace Downer, an extension homemakers club member from Anson County, suggests you use them to make patchwork pillows.

She says neckties make good patchwork designs because you can cut them into different lengths and on the diagonal. The first step, she adds, is to collect old skinny neckties, and rip the seams apart. Then wash and press each tie.

After that, fit the pieces of the neckties together according to color and shape to form a square or

rectangular pillow top. Mrs. Downer uses a feather stitch to sew the pieces together.

The entire pillow cover could be quilted or a backing of fabric in a matching color could be used.

Patchwork pillows made from neckties can make nice holiday or birthday gifts, adds Mrs. Rebecca Gaddy, home economics extension agent.
