New Laws Are **Affecting Benefits**

Amendments to North Carolina's Employment Security Law that became effective July 3, will disqualify certain workers from receiving unemployment payments.

Mrs. Alice W. Bond, Manager of Edenton ESC Job Service office reported that the new provisions deny jobless payments to persons

quit their jobs or job training without good cause, - are discharged from jobs or training because of misconduct.

- refuse offers of suitable jobs or training without good cause, or

- fail to return to customary self-employment when directed.

Under the old law, claimants who quit, were discharged or failed to take job referrals without good cause were disqualified from receiving unemployment payments from four to

Mrs. Bond also said that workers receiving pensions who qualify for unemployment may, in many cases, have payments reduced or done away with entirely.

"Workers drawing jobless benefits while receiving any type of pension based on prior employment will have their unemployment payments reduced by the amount of the pension. Persons whose weekly pension entitlement meets or exceeds their jobless benefit amount will not receive unemployment insurance," she explained.

Individuals receiving pension benefits not based on their prior employment, such as wives receiving social security based on their husband's employment will not be af-

fected by the amendments. The amendments were passed by the General Assembly in March to pro-vide tighter control on unemployment payments.




