NOTICE OF STATE ELECTION to be held on Tuesday, November 8, 1977, in the STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA on the issuance of \$200,000,000 STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA HIGHWAY BONDS and on the issuance of \$220,000,000 STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA CLEAN WATER BONDS. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the qualified voters of Perquimans County that, pursuant to the proclamation issued by Governor James B. Hunt, Jr., dated August 2, 1977 and pursuant to the provisions

contained in Chapters 66, 115, 262, 228 and 498, Session Laws of 1977, the General Assembly of North Carolina has called a State election to be held in each County of the State of North Carolina on Tuesday, November 8, 1977, at which time the question of the issuance of \$200,000,000 State of North Carolina Highway Bonds and at which time the question of the issuance of \$220,000,000 State of North Carolina Clean Water Bonds will be submitted to the qualified voters of the State of North Carolina, which questions shall be voted on.

The issuance of the State of North Carolina Highway Bonds has been authorized by Chapter 443 of the 1977 Session Laws of North Carolina; the issuance of the State of North Carolina Clean Water Bonds has been authorized by Chapter 477 of the 1977 Session Laws, both subject to a favorable vote of a majority of the qualified voters of the State of North Carolina. The polls for this election will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.; provided, however, that at voting places at which voting machines are used the County Board of Elections may permit the polls to remain open until 8:30 p.m. Absentee ballots will be allowed in said election.

In accordance with the general laws of the State of North Carolina, the times and places for registration and the names of the election officials will be determined by the authorized officers of the County and information with reference thereto and as to the location of the voting places may be obtained from the County Board of Elections. TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:
The above-named City proposes to request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-382) to be used for the following project:

The King Street Area Community Development Project is to be initiated including the following:
1. Provide relocation assistance to families and individuals.
2. Provide legal and real estate appraisal fees.
3. Acquisition of land with blighting influence to permit the redevelopment of the area to create

a standard living environment.
4. Provide site clearance and demolition of substandard structures.
5. Provide needed site improvements such as sanitary sewer, storm drainage and paved streets.
6. Provide rehabilitation grants or loans to permit rehabilitation of structures found to be economically feasible for rehabilitation.
The project area consists of approximately 4.7 acres of land in the Town of Hertford in Perquimans County, North Carolina. The project boundary begins at the intersection of Gum Street and King Street thence along the King Street right-of-way in an easterly direction 340' to a property corner; thence southerly along a property line approximately 110' to a property corner; thence easterly along property lines approximately 140' to a property corner; thence northerly along a property line approximately 10' to a property corner; thence easterly along a property line approximately 50' to a property corner; thence northerly along Covent Garden Street approximately 110' to a property corner; thence easterly across Covent Garden Street and along property lines approximately 110' to a property corner; thence southerly along a property line approximately 200' to a property corner; thence westerly along a property line approximately 60' to a property corner on the eastern right-of-way of Covent Garden; thence southerly along the eastern right-of-way of Covent Garden approximately 280' to a point in said right-of-way; thence westerly across Covent Garden and along a line perpendicular to said right-of-way approximately 475' to a point in the eastern right-of-way of Gum Street; thence northerly

along said right-of-way approximately 590' to the point of beginning. The estimated cost of the project is \$479,700.
It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly, the above-named City has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).
The reasons for such decision not to prepare such Statement were as follows:
(1) The project will remove existing blighting influences and will create a more attractive living environment.
(2) Proposed site improvements will provide a better living condition for residents.
(3) Property values will be maintained or increased by the redevelopment of the area with standard homes.
(4) The project will permit the re-plotting of the land to create a standard neighborhood.
(5) No historic sites or structures will be disturbed by proposed project activities.
(6) No adverse effects are anticipated from project activities on the waterways or natural environments.
An Environmental Review Record respecting the environment within the project has been made by the above-named County which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination

and copying, upon request, at the Town Manager's Office, between the hours of 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM.
No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.
All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City to the Mayor of Hertford, North Carolina. Such written comments should be received at the address below on or before October 7, 1977. All such comments so received will be considered and the City will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

Thyroid cancer from X-rays
Question: Are dental X-rays included in the latest thyroid cancer scare? Answer: No. A warning was issued to those people having had X-ray treatment for conditions such as enlargement of the tonsils, adenoids or the thymus gland, acne, ringworm of the scalp, or deafness due to lymphoid tissue around the Eustachian tube. The warning urged such people to let their physician examine their throat and neck, right away, and to repeat the exam at two or three year intervals. Such patients are said to have above-average chances of developing thyroid tumors.

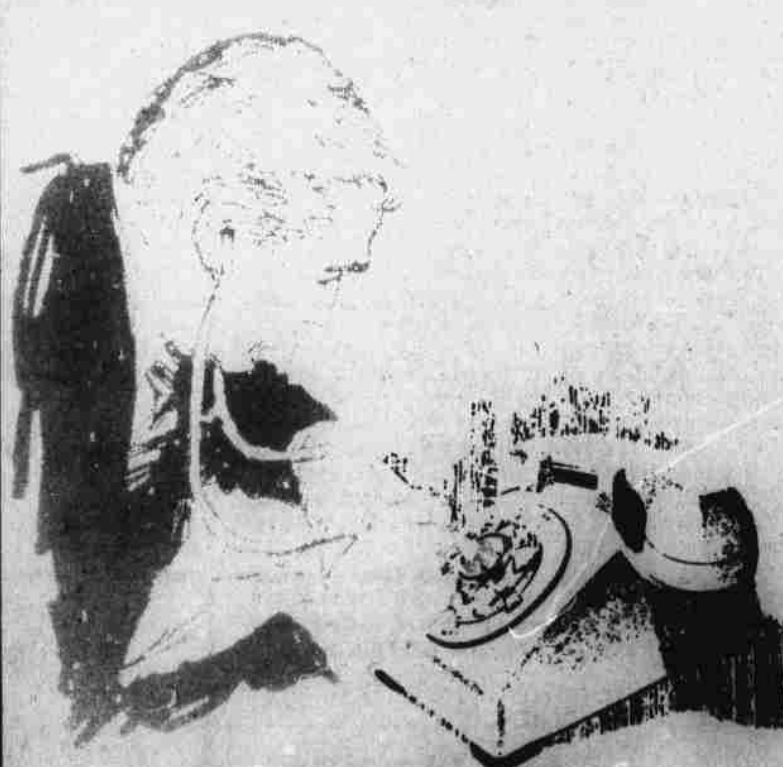


