Merritt theorized that the break-in was allegedly the work of juveniles looking for money only.

Towe Motor Co., located on Dobb St. in Hertford, was the scene of yet another break-in recently, this one occurring on Sept. 15. Clifford Towe, employee, reported the incident to Officer R.L. Harvey at 7:25 a.m. Harvey said entry was gained through a back window on the east side of the building. Nothing was taken however, again due to a policy of removing receipts daily.

Scotties Store, located at the Harris Shopping Center in Hertford, was also recent victim to breaking, entering and larceny. The Sept. incident was investigated by Officer J.R. Logan who reported that someone broke the bathroom window in the rear of the building, entered, and took approximately \$50 in cash from the previous day's receipts. 
got there. The Great Pyramid Decoded by Peter Lemesurier un-covers a code of numbers which contains a record of man's evolution and future.
