Permit Needed

IF YOU BURN! DON'T FORGET YOUR PERMIT!

Brush Burning Permit Law #14-139 requires that persons starting fires within 500 feet of areas under protection of the State Forest Service must have a permit from the State Forester or one of his duly authorized agents. This permit is required all year and there is no charge

This section shall not apply to any fires started or caused to be started, within 100 feet of an occupied dwelling house, if such fires shall be confined within an enclosure from watch is being maintained and which is provided with adequate fire protection equip-

However, a burning permit does not relieve you of complying to local Health Department and Board of Air and Water Resources standards.

The burning permit law is not intended to be an inconvenience to the public but merely a fire prevention tool. The benefits are (1) the Forest Service will know where burning is taking place and when, (2) what type and how much burning activity, (3) if precautionary actions are being taken, and (4) how to get in touch with permittee in the event of hazardous fire weather if burning is cancelled.

The burning permit is one of many indicators a Forest Ranger must use in planning his forest fire control program to prevent forest fires and keep them small when they occur.


