

# Judge Chaffin Presides

Judge John Chaffin presided at the Wednesday session of Perquimans County District Court and disposed of the following cases:

Raeoford Griffin, charged with not having a chauffeur's license, received a thirty day sentence suspended for 2 years, and a fine of \$75.00 and cost;

Kenneth Pattaway was charged with 2 counts of driving with his license revoked (the charges were consolidated for judgment). The defendant was given a seven months sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$400.00 and cost, was ordered not to operate a motor vehicle on the highway until relicensed to do so, and not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws for a period of twelve months;

Robert Curtis Sadler was found guilty of inspection violation and was taxed with a fine of \$35.00 and cost;

Carlton Derriah Butts, charged with driving under the influence of intoxicating beverage, received a ninety day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$100.00 and cost, and was told not to operate a motor vehicle until relicensed to do so, and not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws;

Lawrence Leroy Trafton was found guilty of shoplifting and received a thirty day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$100.00 and cost, was told not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws for twelve months, and not to go on the premises of Colonial Stores for a period of 2 years. An appeal was noted and the case was put on the Superior Court Docket for trial;

Franklin Mann, charged with driving under the influence of intoxicating beverage and driving with no operator's license (the 2 charges were consolidated for trial) and received a ninety day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$175.00 and cost. The defendant was told not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws, not to operate a motor vehicle until

relicensed to do so for twelve months.

Alonga White was taxed with a fine of \$10.00 and cost on an assault charge;

Joseph Elliott was charged with assault on a female and was given a nine months sentence suspended for 3 years, a fine of \$100.00 and cost, was told not to assault his wife for 3 years, and not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws for twelve months;

William Earl Elliott made his first appearance on Wednesday, and Probable Cause hearing was set for November 23. The defendant was released under the same conditions set by Magistrate;

Richard Leon Jordan, charged with reckless driving and driving under the influence of intoxicating beverage, (charges were consolidated for judgment) was sentenced to ninety days suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$150.00 and cost, was told not to operate a motor vehicle until duly relicensed and not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws;

Chris Barnhill was charged with trespassing and assault (the charges were consolidated for trial) and was given a thirty day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$50.00 and cost, was ordered not to go on the property on of pro-

secuting witnesses for 2 years. An appeal was noted and the case was placed on the Superior Court Docket for trial;

Franklin D. Mann was found not guilty of driving with no operator's license, and failure to report an accident;

Linwood Luther Lamb, Jr., charged with driving under the influence and not having an operator's license (consolidated for judgment) received a ninety day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$200.00 and cost, was told not to appear on the N.C. highway until relicensed, and was told not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws;

John Luther White, was taxed with a fine of \$75.00 and cost, was told not to operate a motor vehicle on the highway until relicensed to do so, and not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws;

George Darvin Carver was found guilty of passing a stopped school bus and was given a thirty day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$100.00 and cost, and told not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws for twelve months;

Larry Suzanne Mallory was taxed with cost for a stop sign violation;

Cheryl Lee Gentry was taxed with a fine of \$10.00 and cost for driving on left side of center line. An appeal was noted;

Kent Andrew Mote was taxed with a fine of \$25.00 and cost on speeding charge;

Jarvin Henry Miller was found guilty of passing a stopped school bus and received a thirty day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$100.00 and cost and was told not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws for twelve months.

James Lloyd, charged with passing a stopped school bus, was given a thirty day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$25.00 and cost, and was told not to violate any Federal, State, or local laws for twelve months;

## Check The Children's Eyes

Eye problems affect one out of every 30 pre-school aged children between the ages of three and five and one out of every four school age children. If detected early, about 95 percent of these disorders can be corrected or cured.

Parents play an important role in the early detection. Often children are not even aware they have an eye problem, especially if they have had abnormal vision since birth.

Some common vision

problems are blurred vision caused by irregularities in the shape of the cornea or lens, color blindness, hyperopia (far-sightedness), myopia (near-sightedness), crossed eyes, or glaucoma, which is the presence of abnormally elevated pressures inside the eye.

If your child exhibits any of the following signs of eye trouble, it is important that you consult with your child's pediatrician or ophthalmologist.
