





person whose duty it is to list any property who wilfully fails or refuses to list the same within the time prescribed by law shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed six months. The failure to list shall be prima facie evidence that the failure was wilful. Any person who removes or conceals property for the purpose of evading taxation or who aides or abets the removal or concealment of property for the purpose of evading taxation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars

PROPERTY TAX RELIEF FOR ELDERLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED PERSONS

G.S. 105-277.1 excludes from property taxes the first seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7.500) in assessed value of certain property owned by North Carolins residents aged 65 or older or totally and permanently disabled whose disposable income does not exceed nine thousand dollars (\$9.000). The exclusion covers real property occupied by the owner as his or her permanent residence and/or household personal property used by the owner in connectory with his or her permanent residence. Disposable income includes all moneys received other than gifts or inheritances toceved from a spouse, linear encestors, or linear descendants.
