



The town board of Hertford, N.C. will meet on Jan. 16 at 8 p.m. in the Chamber of Commerce Room of the Municipal Bldg, to establish the town Board of Hertford as the redevelopment commission pursuant to Chapter 160-A Article 22 of the general statutes of N.C. Under this law the town board of Hertford, N.C. will establish themselves as the Redevelopment Commission for areas under their jurisdiction by the passage of a resolution creating the commission to function within the territorial limits of the Township of Hertford, N.C.

Machinery Act of 1971, GS. 105-308, Duty to list; penalty for failure.

Every person in whose name any property is to be listed under the terms of this sub-chapter shall list the property with the tax supervisor or proper list taker within the time allowed by law on an abstract setting forth the information required by this sub-chapter.

In addition to all other penalties prescribed by law, any person whose duty it is to list any property who wilfully fails or refuses to list the same within the time prescribed by law shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed six months. The failure to list shall be prima facie evidence that the failure was wilful.

Any person who removes or conceals property for the purpose of evading taxation or who aides or abets the removal or concealment of property for the purpose of evading taxation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed six months,

PROPERTY TAX RELIEF FOR ELDERLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED PERSONS

G.S. 105-277.1 excludes from property taxes the first seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) in asse alue of certain property owned by North Carolina residents aged 65 or older or totally and permanently dis hose disposable income does not exceed nine thousand dollars (\$9,000). The auclusion covers real pro occupied by the owner as his of her permanent residence and/or household personal property used by the owner to the permanent residence.
