

Farm Meeting Planned

On Monday night, Jan. 9, at 7:30 p.m. there will be a meeting of interest to Perquimans County farmers. During this meeting at the County Office Building, Dr. Fred Mangum, Extension Economist from N.C. State University, will discuss the

Food and Agriculture Act of 1977. "This act is known to many as the New Farm Bill," states Richard H. Bryant, County Extension Chairman.

This act has 19 separate titles that directly affect producer prices and income

for wheat, feed grains, upland cotton, rice, peanuts, soybeans, sugar, dairy, wool and honey. Additionally, farm and consumer welfare is influenced through provisions covering food stamps and commodity distribution programs, Public Law 480 exports, grain inspection, nutrition and agricultural research and extension.

"I realize that all the provisions of the Farm Bill do not affect us because we do not grow certain crops mentioned above. You, as a farmer, do need to understand this new farm bill and how it affects loans, disaster payments and a number of other items."

"This could be one of the most important meetings affecting our farmers in 1978. I hope each local farmer will make an attempt to attend or have someone there to listen to this discussion. It may be the best nights work farmers can do all year," further states Bryant.

Pork Conference Is Scheduled

The 22nd annual North Carolina Pork Producers Conference will be held in Raleigh, Jan. 12-13, at the Royal Villa Motor Inn.

The conference is jointly sponsored by North Carolina State University, the N.C. Pork Producers Association and the N.C. Department of Agriculture. Registration begins at 8 a.m., Thursday, the 12th, and the session starts at 9 a.m. Educational presentations will resume at 9 a.m. Friday.

Congressman Charles Rose (D-NC) will be among the speakers. Others will include research and extension specialists from the University of Illinois,

University of Kentucky, and NCSU; North Carolina pork producers and industry representatives; NCDA veterinarian Dr. Tom Zweigart; Bertin Knoblauch, a farmer from Lowpoint, Ill.; Dr. James Keating, M.D., director of gastroenterology at Washington University, St. Louis, Mo., and Norman Coats, an economist with Ralston Purina, St. Louis.

Among the topics to be discussed are the use of crossbred boars, solar energy in swine buildings, the health concerns over the use of nitrates in cured pork and other production, housing and health-related subjects.
