These developments will hopefully help dairy farmers maintain a reasonable return on their investment, management, and labor while continuing to provide consumers with

a high quality product at reasonable prices.

Today's successful dairy requires teamwork and close attention to all phases of the dairy operation. While the modern dairyman doesn't have to be an expert in all areas of the operation, he does need general knowledge of the various professions having a direct bearing on his business. He must be a skilled businessman in every sense of the word if he is to be able to stay in the business of producing "nature's most nearly perfect" food.

June Dairy Month seems to be a natural time to thank our dairy farmers for providing the finest milk and dairy products in the world.
