The Albemarle Area American Legion Baseball team has accepted a challenge from the former Albemarle League to play one more baseball game this season.

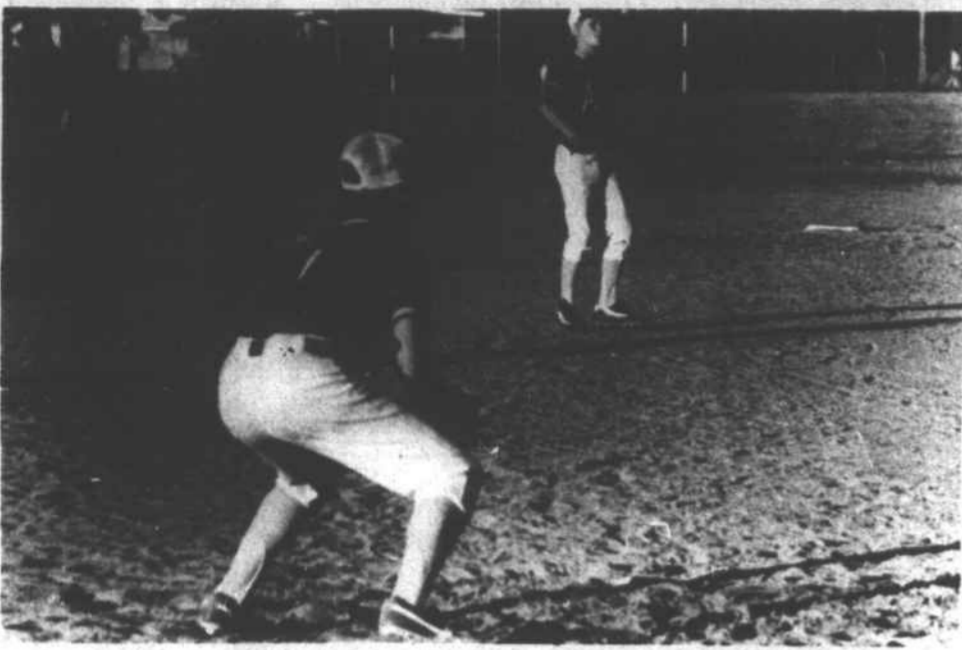

SECTION 9-2.1.1
RE: BUILDING PERMITS
No building or other structure shall be erected, moved, added to, or structurally altered without a permit therefor, issued by the Building Inspector. No building permit shall be issued except in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance, except after written order from the Building Adjustment.
Any violation of this ordinance will result in legal action and is considered a misdemeanor.
