The Museum of the Albemarle will host an Antique Show and Sale the first weekend in November at the Museum on Hwy. 17 South of Elizabeth City. The show will open Friday evening from 6 to 9 p.m. Saturday hours are 11 a.m. to 9 p.m.; and, on Sunday 1 to 6 p.m. Admission to the Museum and show is \$1.50, or \$1 with an advertising card available at area shops. All proceeds at the door will benefit the Museum which serves the 10 county Albemarle area.

A colonial "Tea Room" featuring old North Carolina recipes will be run by the Pasquotank Extension Homemakers Club in the lobby of the Museum. A full Bill of Fare will be served all three days by the ladies who will serve wearing costumes of the period. A full dinner menu will be available Friday evening.

Another feature this year will be the display of antique cars in the Museum courtyard from 1 to 3 p.m. on Sunday.
