"Our team looks very strong," Coach Pete Hunter said about this season's JV Basketball squad at Perquimans County High School. The team finished second to the Northampton Rams in last year's tournament.

The Pirates have four of the five starters of last year's group returning.

Tony Hickson and George Jackson, two quality players, will be in the forward spots again. Jackson is a fierce competitor while Hunter describes Hickson as "the best shooter in PCHS".

Johnnie Frierson and Nate Carson will take command of the guard positions. Also returning from last year's team will be Alvin White, a good sixth
