SSI Must Report

Albemarle area residents who receive a gold monthly Supplemental Security Income check must report to their local Social Security office if they go to work.

These reports are required because a change in income may effect the amount of the SSI check.

SSI recipients must also report any change in the income or working status of their husband or wife even though the husband or wife may not receive an SSI check themselves.

Any change in income may effect the amount of an SSI check.

Changes such as marriage, divorce, separation, change of address, sale of a car or house, and changes in bank accounts may effect the SSI check and must be reported.

Social Security reviews the eligibility of all SS recipients at least once a year to be sure that payments are based on correct information.

Eligibility is also reviewed when changes occur, that may affect the SSI payment.

More information about reporting changes is given in the booklet "What You Have to Know about SSI." The booklet is available at all local Social Security offices.

The Elizabeth City Social Security office is located at 111 Jordan Plaza next to Southgate Mall (phone 388-2161) and is open 9 a.m. to 4:30 weekdays.
