Court

Judge John T. Chaffin presided at the regular session of Perquimans County District Court and heard the following cases:

Willie Rogers Brooks, charged with driving under the influence (2nd offense), received a ninety day sentence suspended for 2 years, was told not to drive until licensed to do so, not to violate any laws for a period of twelve months, report to Mental Health within one day, abide by instructions, and to keep appointments.

Shirley T. Cooper was charged with two counts of disorderly conduct, which were consolidated for judgement. The defendant was given a ninety day jail sentence.

John Henry Askew was found guilty of assault on a female and received a nine months sentence suspended for 3 years, a fine of \$150 and cost. The defendant was ordered not to assault the prosecuting witness for a period of 3 years and not to violate any laws for twelve months.

Colleen Marie Aldridge's charges of speeding greater than reasonable and prudent, and failure to drive on the right half of highway, were consolidated for judgement. The defendant received ninety day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$200 and cost was told not to operate a motor vehicle in North Carolina until licensed to do so, and not to violate any laws for twelve months. An appeal was noted.

Kathleen Felton was found guilty of simple assault and received a thirty day sentence suspended for 3 years, was ordered to pay costs of court, was told not to violate any laws for a period of twelve months, not to assault either parents for a period of 3 years, and not to cause any problem for parents for 3 years (in home).

Josua Warren Overton's first appearance for a charge of Robbery with a dangerous weapon was held on Wednesday, and the Probable Cause was found in the case of Joseph Riddick, charged with forgery and uttering, and the case was placed on the Superior Court Docket for trial.

Ronald Dean Harper, charged with assault by pointing a gun, was given a thirty day sentence suspended for 2 years, a fine of \$25 and cost. The defendant was told not to violate any laws for twelve months, and not to have a gun off his premises for a period of twelve months.

John Willie Skinner's Probable Cause Hearing for bigamy was held and the case was placed on Superior Court Docket trial; Lester T. Keel, Jr. was found not guilty of unauthorized use of a conveyance.

Machinery Act of 1971, GS. 105-308, Duty to list; penalty for failure.

Every person in whose name any property is to be listed under the terms of this sub-chapter shall list the property with the tax supervisor or proper list taker within the time allowed by law on an abstract setting forth the information required by this sub-chapter.

In addition to all other penalties prescribed by law, any person whose duty it is to list any property who willfully fails or refuses to list the same within the time prescribed by law shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed six months. The failure to list shall be prima facie evidence that the failure was willful.

Any person who removes or conceals property for the purpose of evading taxation or who aids or abets the removal or concealment of property for the purpose of evading taxation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed six months.

PROPERTY TAX RELIEF FOR ELDERLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED PERSONS
 G.S. 105-277.1 excludes from property taxes the first seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) in assessed value of certain property owned by North Carolina residents aged 65 or older or totally and permanently disabled whose disposable income does not exceed nine thousand dollars (\$9,000). The exclusion covers real property occupied by the owner as his or her permanent residence and/or household personal property used by the owner in connection with his or her permanent residence. Disposable income includes all moneys received other than gifts or inheritances received from a spouse, blood ancestors, or blood descendants.
