# Art Council to organize

What is an arts council? Well, this question along with many more will be answered on Sunday, Feb. 4, when a public meeting will be held to discuss the possible reorganization of the Perquimans County Arts Council.

This meeting, to be held in the courtroom, of the Perquimans County Courthouse, will begin at 3 p.m., with all interested citizens of Perquimans County invited to attend.

An arts council, as defined in a letter which was mailed this past week to local artists, businessmen, clubs, and organizations, is an organization which strives to develop, promote, and coordinate the

arts at a community level. In Perquimans County, programs in the arts (painting, drawing, crafts, dance, music, and drama, just to mention a few) are sponsored within the schools and by the Perquimans County Recreation Department. But these programs, with the help of an arts council, could be expanded, improved and more comprehensive, thus giving the people of Perquimans County a better opportunity to excel in the arts.

The range of activities of an arts council are limitless. In addition to serving as the collective voice of the arts, councils

can sponsor art festival, offer classes, hold exhibits, put on concerts, bring workshops and performances into this county; the possibilities are as broad as the arts council's imagination.

With the help of an arts council, a talented high school student can get financial aid for art related studies. With the help of an arts council, classes that you have been attending outside of your county, can be brought into our county.

With the help of an arts council, classes can be organized in various programs areas, possibly discovering a talent that you did not know you had.

But, to have a successful arts council, hard-working, interested, people must be found to serve. People must be willing to donate of their time and efforts.

If you are interested in the arts-council idea make your plans to attend the public meeting on Sunday, Feb. 4, at 3 p.m. in the Perquimans County Courthouse.

# Area Coordinator Chosen to Attend Iowa Convention

Carlotta Jordan, Coordinator of the Aging Program for ARPCD, has been chosen by a National Screening Committee as the State of North Carolina's delegate to a National Strategy Conference to be held in Des Moines, Iowa, on January 28 through February 2,

1979. Miss Jordan will be joining delegates from each of the remaining 49 states in a week long work session to develop strategies which will improve the delivery of human services to this nation's rural elderly population.

The Elizabeth City resi-

dent will be put into one of seven work groups to address the problems encountered by rural agencies in the following areas: transportation, nutrition, housing, health, outreach/acceptability/and accessibility of services, income/employment, and administration/management and training.

Throughout the week long session, delegates and alternates will spend a considerable amount of time in their assigned areas to identify issues and develop comprehensive strategies to deal with these problems. The ultimate goal of this

Conference will be the development of consolidated strategies in programmatic areas which will be of assistance in addressing rural issues at the national, state and local level. The Conference results will be distributed throughout the National Aging Network to help

rural providers improve, coordinate, and consolidate existing programs

Conference will also provide delegates an opportunity to sensitize legislative and administrative leaders from Washington to the special and peculiar needs of this

nations' rural elderly.

The National Strategy Conference will conclude with the delegates addressing whether or not there is a need to form a National Rural Aging Coalition, for the purpose of speaking at the National level in a unified voice.
