The second installment of estimated federal tax payments on 1979 income is due June 15, 1979, the Internal Revenue Service said.

This installment should be paid using declaration voucher number 2 found in the Form 1040-ES package.

Taxpayers whose anticipated income changed

during 1979 may have to file an amended declaration. Space is provided in the estimated tax package to compute an amended estimate, the IRS said.

## COOKS

A favorite for hot summer days is potato salad. Try this recipe for a change from the usual version with pickles and celery. It is an attractive dish and will serve eight persons.

- 8 medium size potatoes boiled in skins
- 1 1/2 cups mayonnaise
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 1/4 teaspoons Horseradish
- 1 teaspoon celery seed
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup fresh parsley, chopped
- 2 medium onions finely chopped

Peel potatoes and slice thinly. Combine all of the above ingredients except parsley and onions. Layer potatoes in a large glass dish and salt lightly. Cover the layer of potatoes with a layer of the mayonnaise/sour cream mixture. Sprinkle with onions and chopped parsley. Continue the layers until both potatoes and mayonnaise mixture is used. End layering with the mayonnaise mixture and top with parsley. Cover and refrigerate eight hours before serving.
