FORT RALEIGH READY FOR FIFTH SEASON OF THE LOST COLONY: The 354th anniversary celebration of the founding of Anglo-American civilization and the birth of Virginia Dare of Fort Raleigh will begin July 3rd, with the opening of the 5th season of Paul Green's patriotic drama "The Lost Colony" as the highlight of the summer-long celebration. With more than 525,000 persons from all sections of the nation and several foreign countries attending the celebration during the past four years, 100,000 more are expected here at the birthplace of the nation before the season closes with a gala performance on Labor Day, September, 1, 1941.

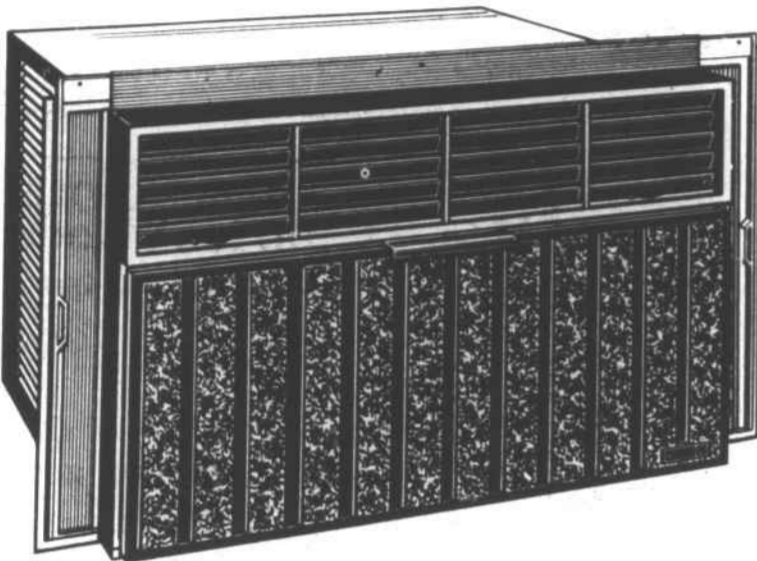
IT WAS THE LARK by Catherine MacArthur, is a story of compassion and courage. The compassion and courage displayed by a family faced with the tragic consequences of love.
