#### **Fishing** tax

RALIEGH - A proposal is afoot to expand the Dingell-Johnson Act which provides for an excise tax of fishing equipment.

Under the expansion, a 3 per cent excise tax would be charged on all new boats. motors and trailers. Fishing tackle covered by the act is currently taxed at 10 per cent.

The funds produced by the Dingell-Johnson program are distributed among the states depending on each state's land and water area and the number of fishing licenses sold.


