# Ash from wood fire can be dangerous

on the increase, and so is the totally consumed. number of forest fires caused by ashes removed from stoves and fireplaces, according to the North Carolina Division of Forest Resources. The light powdery ash left from a wood fire can insulate hot coals and glowing embers hiding them

The use of wood burning these coals to smolder for Some people prefer to store compost pile or spread on a stoves and fireplace inserts is several days before they are the ashes in a larger metal

Ashes removed from a wood stove or fireplace should be put in a metal bucket and placed outside away from buildings. The bucket should be secured or anchored so it will not be tipped over by from view. It is not unusual for people, animals or the wind.
