Public Announcement

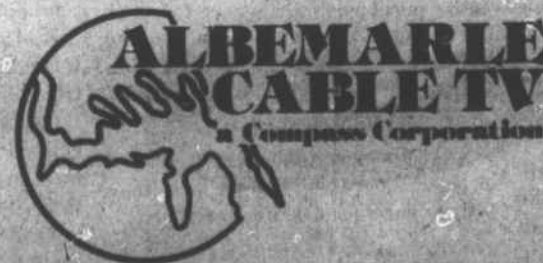
