
Wide World of Sports

The 1981 P.C.H.S. Football Team faced several challenges as it approached this past season. Some of them were as follows: replace several key seniors who had graduated; play a tougher schedule than the past two years; avoid complacency due to the outstanding 1980 season; work together as a team rather than as individuals; and avoid injuries. Despite a slow start, the Pirates met these challenges and finished the season as conference champs with a fine 8-2-1 record.

Highlights of the season were a second straight victory over Edenton Holmes, an undefeated conference record, and an opportunity to participate in the playoffs.

Offensive leaders this year were Donnie Parker, quarterback; James Banks and James Bunch, running backs; James Riddick, Terry Lightfoot, and Robert Mallory, receivers; and Mark Lindsey, Melvin Coston, Derrick Johnson, and Troy Edwards, linemen.

Lady Pirates

The Lady Pirates' basketball season was one of ups and downs. They had a record of 8-14. Their wins included victories over 3-A foes Plymouth and Bertie. The Pirates were led by all-conference selection Bathsheba Ormond with 11.9 points per game and 8.2 rebounds and Juanita Green with 11.0 points and 10.4 rebounds. The highlight of the season was the conference tournament. The Pirates upset the Raiders from Murfreesboro and conference champion Gates County the first two nights, advancing to the championship game.
