Stop wrinkles

If you're not careful, you can heatset wrinkles in your synthetic fabrics. This can happen during the washes's spin cycle if the wash water

is too hot.

But don't get discouraged too soon.

Sometimes it is possible to get those

Wet the garments and rinse them in water with one tablespoon of fabric softener. Tumble dry with other clean clothes for at least ten minutes, but never more than twenty minutes. Overdrying wastes energy and can be hard on the fabric.

As soon as clothes are dry, hang them up. If the wrinkles still remain, you can try a warm or hot water wash, but take the clothes out before the spin cycle. Then tumble dry

If neither of these methods work then try pressing the clothes. But be careful. The iron must be set at the appropriate setting. If it's too hot, it will stick and melt the fabric.
