work for the project, while Winslow investigated archives in both here and in Raleigh, where most of the very old records are kept.

Winslow reckons Haley interviewed about 500 people — including residents of historic sites, former residents, and persons knowledgeable in area history — as well as investigated the authenticity of sites and photographed them. And in the process, Haley said Wednesday, Perquimans County has become "a home" for her.

"She probably knows more about Perquimans County than most of its

residents," Winslow said.

Field work began on the book in January, 1979, and was completed that September. Writing the book — Haley and Winslow often collaborating over the telephone between Raleigh and Hertford — began in September, 1979 and was complete in September of this year. "I spent last Christmas writing footnotes," Winslow said. "I don't recommend it."

Originally intended as a book of about 100 pages, the project grew to over two and a half times that size. "Some people wondered if they'd ever get anything for their money," Cox admitted.

The mayor added, "We've had the cooperation of hundreds of people in this project. Every person in every house volunteered their time."

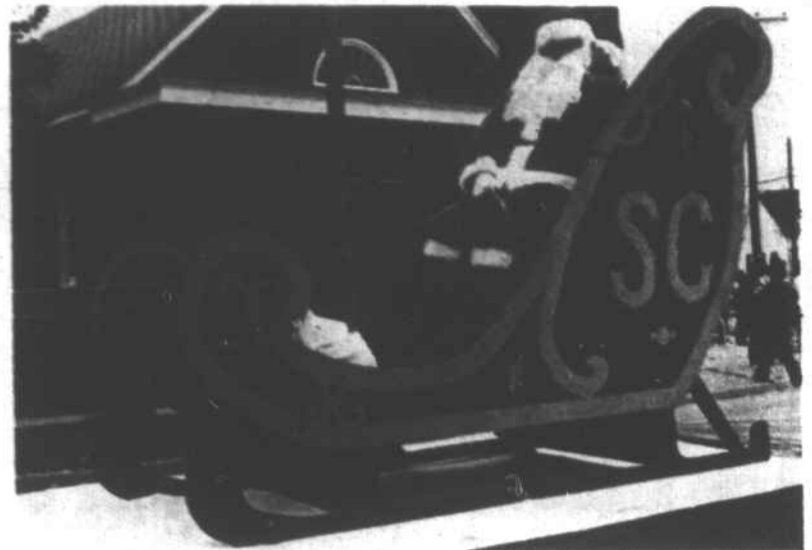
