Jobless may get benefits

Thousands of jobless North arolinians may be eligible for exded benefits according to Glenn R. Jernigan, chairman of the N.C. **Employment** Security Commission ESC).

Mrs. Alice W. Bond, manager of The Edenton ESC announced the -Extended Benefits (EB) Program ""triggered on" with the week ending January 29 and the first payable week will be the week ending February 19. The program is activated legally by a period of sustained high unemployment, and it begins the third week after the week in which there is a 'trigger on" indicator.

Jernigan said, "We estimate that up to 15,000 unemployed individuals. who are currently filing claims for "unempmloyment insurance benefits, may be eligible to receive up to 13 additional weeks of benefits." EB payments have the same monetary value as regular unemmployment insurance benefits. The EB Program will last 13 weeks, and it can be extended only ilf the unemployment _rate maintains a level high enough to "'trigger in' another period.

A native of Chowan County, she was the daughter of the late Frank V. and Mrs. Martha Boyce Byrum and the wife of the late Miles E. Bunch.


She was a homemaker and a member of the Rocky Hock Baptist Church.
