## March is the best time to top dress

top dressing our wheat, oats and barley. March is the best time to top dress. On-farm tests have shown that topdressing in March generally produces $5-12$ bushels more wheat
than topdressing in April than topdressing in April. Top-
dressing in March is better than dressing in March is better than
topdressing in February bescause it delays the buildup of diseases. particularly powdery mildew and glume blotch. It also reduces the chance of freeze damage resulting from early lush growth

I would recommend that growers not exceed a total of 100 pounds of
nitrogen per acre for wheat and oats. Apply only 80 pounds per acre for barley. If nitrogen was applied in the fertilizer, then this should be substracted from the total requirement to determine the amount of nitrogen for topdressing. The amount of nitrogen needed can be reduced
where small grain follows soybeans or peanuts. Allow 20 pounds per acre
