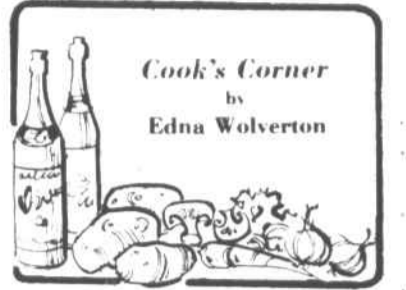
Make a meal of hearty Greek salad sandwiches

GREEK SALAD SANDWICH

- 1/2 c. avocado, chopped
- 1/2 c. tomato, chopped
- 1/2 c. green onion, chopped
- 1/2 c. Fita cheese, crumbled
- Fresh alfalfa sprouts
- Sliced, ripe olives

Make dressing according to package directions. Brown beef, seasoning with salt and pepper (garlic powder also if desired). Cut each bread in half and carefully open pocket with fingers.
