## It's strawberry pickin' time in Perquimans

"God could have made a better berry, but doubtless God never did," said William Butler of the strawberry, back in the 17th century.

This sentiment is shared by many today, as indicated by the carloads traveling to Perquimans County's "only "pick-your-own" strawberry

Owned and operated by Thurman and Faye Harrell, the local strawberry patch is located in Bear Swamp and is well into its 1983

The season doesn't last long, according to Mrs. Harrell, beginning usually around mid-May and climaxing during Memorial Day

"We hope they (strawberries) last through next week-Memorial weekend is usually a big one," she

Mrs. Harrell described this year's strawberry crop as "tremendous," in spite of the cool wet spring which Perquimans residents experienced.

Strawberries are a versatile fruit and can be found in all sorts of entrees, from jam to congealed salad, to nut breads to tarts. And you can't beat them freshly capped, topped with sweetened fresh whipped

Perquimans Extension Home Economist Juanita Bailey suggests freezing the bright berries, so they can be enjoyed all year. Both the flavor and bright color, as well as the vitamins, can be preserved when

However, strawberries lose much of the vitamin C if capped and left exposed to air, according to Bailey. If they are to be held for a few days, they should be stored, uncapped and unwashed in the refrigerator.

Anyway you take them, these are scrumptious berries. They are almost universally enjoyed-and serve as one of the many attractions in Perquimans County.

Faye Harrell's Recipies Strawberry Nut Cake 1 yellow cake mix

1 strawberry jello

1 cup Wesson oil

1 cup berries ⅓ cup milk

4 eggs 1 cup coconut

1 cup nuts Mix and bake at 350. You can use fresh or frozen strawberries with

recipe. Just crush and sweeten the berries. Icing

1 box powdered sugar 1 stick margarine 1/2 cup berries 1/2 cup nuts

Mix and spread on cake. Sprinkle top with 1/2 cup coconut.

Strawberry Glaze Pie

Bake and cool a pie crust (regular or graham cracker). Wash and cap one quart of fresh strawberries. Cut up one cup of the berries and mix one

cup sugar and three tablespoons of corn starch in a two quart saucepan. Stir in one cup of water gradually until smooth. Add the cut up berries and cook over medium heat until thick and clear. Stir in a few drops of red food coloring. Cool. Stir in remaining berries, saving 4 cup for garnish. Pour into pie crust and chill until firm. (about 3 hours.) Garnish with cool whip and remaining berries.

Pie Crust (makes 2) This is a good crust for the above pie or any fruit pie

1 stick margarine 1 cup flour (self-rising) ¼ cup brown sugar 1 cup nuts

Mix together and press into pie pan with fingers. Cook at 350 for 15 minutes or until light brown. Cool before adding pie.
