

June 15, 1963, is a date to circle on the calendar as a reminder to taxpayers owing estimated taxes. This is the due date for paying the second installment of Federal estimated taxes for 1982.

During Fiscal Year 1982, North Carolina citizens filing estimated tax filed more than 620,000 returns and paid in almost \$1.5 billion in taxes.

A declaration of estimated tax must be made if gross income for 1982 include more than \$500 in income not subject to withholding AND the estimated tax due is \$200 or more.

"Estimated tax" is the amount of tax owed for the year after subtracting the amount of tax expected to be withheld and the amount of credits expected to be taken on the 1982 Form 1040.

For further information on paying estimated taxes, call the IRS toll-free number, 1-800-424-1040. This number is subject to monitoring to ensure prompt, courteous, and accurate responses.
