"Parents who have moved into North Carolina from other states should have their children's records verified without delay so they will have them ready to present to the schools in the fall. Don't wait until the last minute when scheduling

appointments may be difficult." The immunization law requires students to be vaccinated within 30 days after the opening of school.

After that deadline, students who don't have their shots will not be allowed to attend school until they present a current record of immunization.

Campbell said, "All of the required shots may be obtained from private physicians or the Pasquotank-Perquimans-Camden-Chowan District Health Department."
