The Town of Hertford is requesting proposals from qualified consulting firms to provide administrative assistance in connection with a NRCD-funded community revitalization project. Project activities include:

- Acquisition of substandard property (11 residential and 3 commercial)
- Relocation of 18 affected households
- Clearance and disposition of acquired property
- Rehabilitation of 23 housing units
