Taxpayers will be charged for photocopies

Effective October 1, taxpayers requesting photocopies of their income tax returns will be required to pay for the copies in advance, the Internal Revenue Service announced. The Internal Revenue Service said that the charge for a photocopy of a tax return will be \$5.00 and the charge for a transcript of tax account information will be \$2.50. To make these requests, taxpayers should complete Form 4506, Request

for Copy of Tax Form (or Individual Income Tax Account Information), and mail it to the address shown on the form. The form has been revised to include instructions for the advance payments and the new amounts to be charged. Requiring payment in advance will ensure that the total cost of securing and furnishing photocopies or tax account information will be paid by those individuals who request information.
