October is National Head Start Awareness Month. It is a national drive to make the public aware of the program. Head Start is a comprehensive developmental program for children ages 3-5. It is based on the premise that all children share certain needs and that children from low income

families, in particular, can benefit from a program designed to meet those needs. The program operates in the context of the child's total environment, classroom and family. It stresses not only education, but also health, nutrition, mental health, social services and parent involvement.

The Head Start Program has been operating in the Tri-county area since 1965. Presently, seven counties are served: Chowan, Dare, Gates, Hyde, Pasquotank, Perquimans and Washington. There is a total of 270 children. Within the next month the program will expand into Currituck and Tyrrell Counties adding a total of 55 children. The public is invited to visit the Head Start centers this special month and all during the year. Volunteer services are always welcomed. For information call 482-4495.

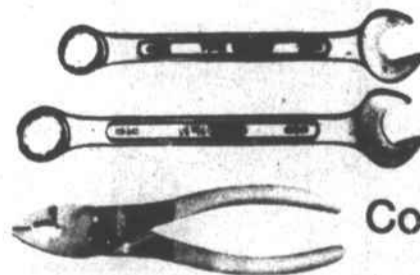

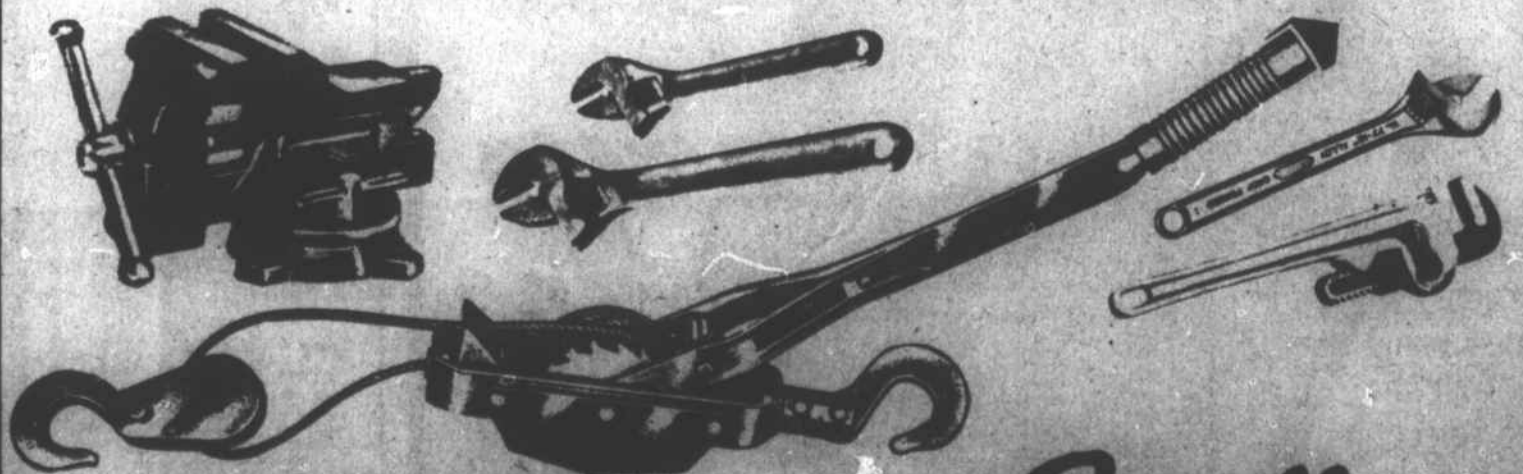
